

JICC Invited the Malaysia Delegation to Japan

JICC invited Malaysia Delegation (Officials from Ministry of Energy Transition and Water Transformation, Energy Commission, MyPower, Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation, TNB and PETRONAS) from 10th March to 15th March 2025.

【Background/Objectives】 ;

The Malaysian government is considering expanding renewable energy sources (hydrogen, ammonia, solar, geothermal, wind, and hydropower) to achieve its decarbonization goal (carbon neutrality by 2050), and has established the Ministry of Energy Transition and Water Reform in December 2023 to restart the study for deployment of nuclear power. It has also been announced that the deployment of nuclear power will be included in the 13th Malaysia Plan. Considering such background, JICC invited the Malaysia Delegation to deepen their understanding on current situation of nuclear power and trend in nuclear industries in Japan.

【Results】 ;

- ① The Delegation visited Japan Atomic Power Company (JAPC) Tsuruga Power Station and FUKUI Nuclear Center “At Home”, and paid a courtesy meeting to Japan Atomic Energy Commission, Cabinet Office and International Nuclear Energy Cooperation Agency of Natural Resources and Energy METI to deepen their understanding on current situation of Japan’s nuclear power. They also paid a courtesy meeting to H.E. Deputy Ambassador of Malaysia to Japan.
- ② The Delegation had meeting with JAPC HQ, IHI, JGC and as well as shop tour for IHI Yokohama Works to deepen their understanding on nuclear industries in Japan.
